

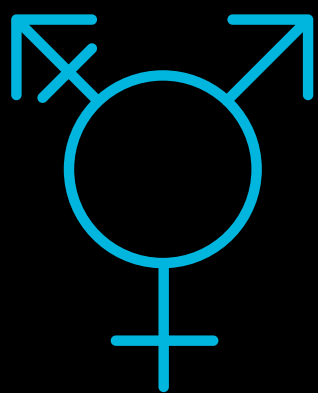
COMMUNITY LEGAL CENTRES IN NSW

Clients are often experiencing financial hardship, social disadvantage, domestic or family violence, or discrimination. The below statistics are from CLC NSW's 2019-2020 Annual Report and provide an overview of clients who used CLC services.

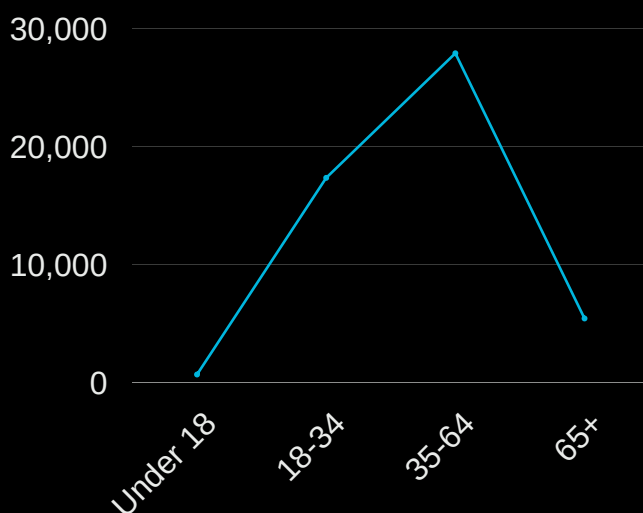


PEOPLE WERE SUPPORTED BY CLCS



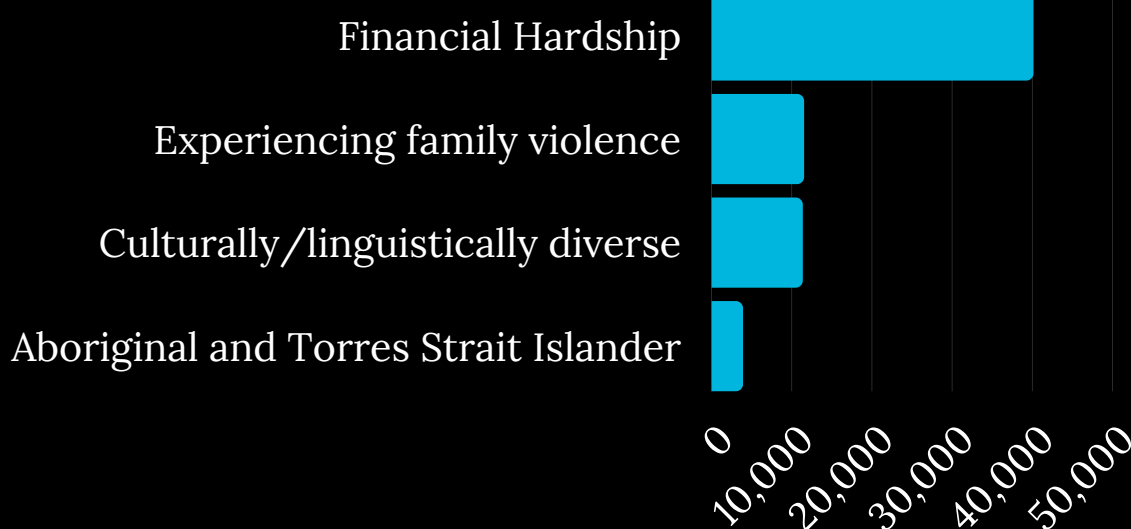
CLCS ENGAGED WITH:

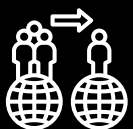
